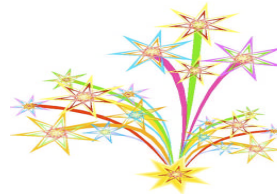

Fireworks



Please follow the rules and be courteous to your neighbors. The loud fireworks can be very upsetting to pets and small children. Limiting their use in Deer Run would be greatly appreciated.

Poulsbo Municipal Codes govern the use of Fireworks

B. No person shall ignite, explode, use, burn, or discharge any fireworks at any time within the city except:

- 1. Between the hours of twelve noon and eleven p.m. on June 28th of each year;**
- 2. Between the hours of nine a.m. and eleven p.m. on each day from June 29th through July 4th of each year;**
- 3. Between the hours of nine a.m. and nine p.m. on July 5th of each year;**

Garden Tips

Rhododendrons are in bloom... As the flowers fade, the time is right to prune and shape them for next year's flower display. If you are happy with the plants size and shape, all you need to do is dead head (remove the dead flower parts). This will cause the plant to put its energy into new growth rather than seed production. Rhodies can be cut back below the foliage if you cut above a healthy bud. Buds form at the base of leaves. Look for healthy buds on the stem that will grow in the direction you desire. Buds growing away from the center are best. New flower buds form in the fall to bloom in the spring. After severe pruning, it may take a year or two before the plant recovers enough to set flowers.

Sidewalk and Traffic Safety

Several neighbors have mentioned that some trees overhang the sidewalks and also intrude into drivers' lines of sight at a couple of our intersections. We urge homeowners that have trees bordering sidewalks and intersections to inspect their trees and prune them while tree trimming season is upon us. Additionally, moss and leaves on sidewalks makes walking difficult and is a potential liability for the homeowner.
