## Volunteers knocking on doors to map Deer Run resources

Neighborhood captains on the Deer Run Emergency Preparedness Task Group will be going door-to-door to map our neighborhood resources. Chaired by Erin Roberts, a Deer Run resident and U.S. Coast Guard Contingency Planner, the task group plans to identify the skills and resources Deer Run would have available in a major emergency. Please give them your cooperation.

The likelihood of earthquakes and winter storms is high in our area. A temporary power outage may be a minor inconvenience; but a major disaster could leave us isolated and totally on our own for days, or even weeks. Police, fire departments and other emergency resources will focus on the most urgent needs of hospitals, schools and public facilities, leaving neighborhoods like ours dependent on our own resources. We will be our own first responders, so we'll need to know what resources we will have available.

# The new face of Deer Run



Deer Run has a new fence and a new face on Noll Road and along our Bjorn St. entrance.

The original fence was built by Deer Run developer Schneider Homes about 22 years ago, and has been repaired more than once at the expense of DRCO. The DRCO Board made the decision to replace it at DRCO expense because it is our public face on a main thoroughfare. Fences that adjoin private

properties are the responsibility of the adjoining property owners.

The fence will be allowed to weather over the winter, and the DRCO Board will solicit quotes on staining the new fence next summer, including retouching the Bjorgin Creek fences and the walkway to the NK Middle School athletic field.

The Noll Road landscaping will also be upgraded with drought resistant plantings.

Quality Home Solutions was the DRCO Board's unanimous choice for this project, based on price and known performance. Work was timed to minimize downtime for each resident. The crew removed and replaced all fencing one yard at a time.

The DRCO Board had a choice of fence styles and chose to conform with the predominant style of the Deer Run neighborhood.

The Deer run neighborhood picnic in Raab Park on July 30th featured live birds of prey, plus great food and free ice cream for some two dozen residents of Deer Run.
